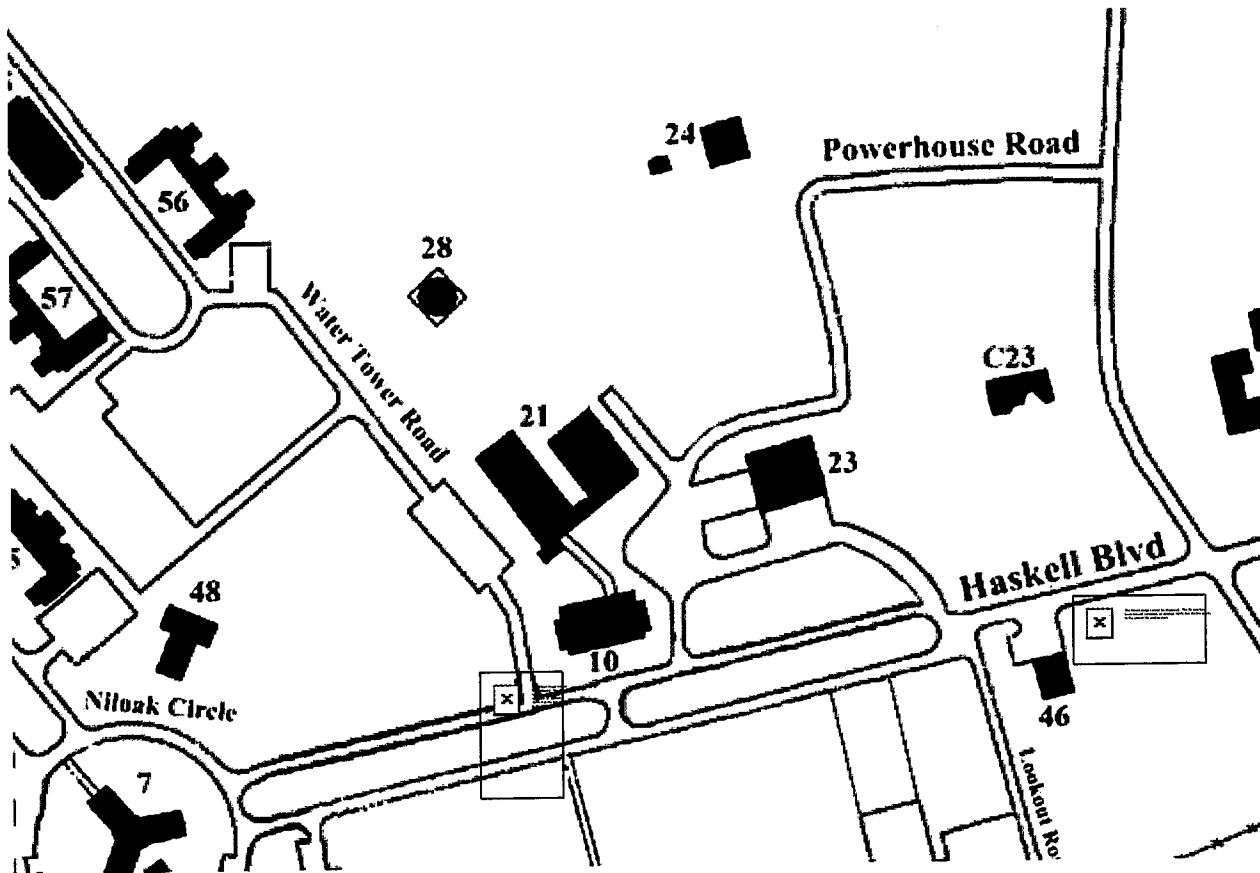
Earning your Technician Class license is the first step to exploring all that Ham Radio has to offer.

1. Take I-30 west toward Texarkana
2. Take Exit 114
3. At the end of the exit ramp, take a LEFT onto US 67
4. Stay on US 67 for about 3 or 4 miles and you will enter Haskell and see an intersection
5. At that intersection, take a LEFT onto Highway 229
6. Stay on Highway 229 for about a mile
7. On the right, you will see the Arkansas Health Center sign which will be Haskell Blvd
8. Turn RIGHT onto Haskell Blvd (Blue arrow on map)
9. Building 10 will be the second building on the right (Orange arrow on map)
10. I will have a sign in the road pointing toward the building
11. The multipurpose room will be the double white doors. I will have a sign on the door.
